### NHA recognizes Class XI Leadership Institute graduates

*LINCOLN* — The Nebraska Hospital Association (NHA) Leadership Institute graduated its 11th class Friday.

The NHA Leadership Institute, which now has more than 250 alumni, is an intensive leadership development program designed specifically for hospital managers.

The 34 Class XI graduates were honored before more than 525 people in attendance at the 35th Anniversary of the Caring Kind Awards Luncheon held Oct. 24 at The Cornhusker Marriott in Lincoln.

Participants in the intensive leadership development program, designed specifically for hospital managers, completed 40 hours of instruction and training, individualized reading, personality assessments, 360 degree feedback exercises and management coaching.

They also engaged in a variety of leadership-oriented topics, including building a foundation of leadership, using 360 assessments for improved leadership, working with conflict, analyzing performance issues, personality traits in the workplace, coaching for improved performance, leading across the generations, leading teams and succession management. This year's participants also participated in a job shadowing experience where they met with managers from other hospitals throughout the state.
