Put Me In, Coach: Advanced Coaching Skills

The first session of the afternoon will kick off an engaged day of discussion and peer interaction. Enhance your ability to confidently communicate, connect, and engage with your team members to maximize overall organizational performance. Participants will experience the power of providing high-quality feedback and the impact it has on performance, and apply the traits of effective coaching to organizational culture. Learners who participate in this session will build effective communication skills and practice a coaching model for enhancing performance.

Practicing the skills in the morning session allows participants to formalize the concepts and make the learning immediately applicable. Furthermore, it sets the stage for the rest of the day where communication across hospitals and across the twelve classes of Leadership Institute participants is essential.

Have No Fear: Change Management is Here

The most dangerous words in business are either "We've always done it that way," or "Everybody else is doing it." You need a model that empowers your organization to better identify changes in the strategic environment and create an action plan for addressing the change. In order to progress as a business and continue to develop programs that best suit the needs of your customers, resources have to be available to grow and adapt. This session will cover the innovative approaches and curiosity needed to take performance to the next level.

More than "best practices," sharing success cases and collaborating across teams is proven to affect significant positive change in business.
