

CMS Hospital Improvement Act Proposed Changes Nursing, Medical Records, Infection Control, Antibiotic Stewardship Program, Restraints, QAPI, 5-Star Rating Program and More

OVERVIEW

This session will review CMS' proposed changes to the hospital conditions of participation (CoPs). Every hospital should know about these changes, including critical access hospitals. These proposed changes include changes to nursing, medical records, infection control, QAPI, patient rights, and restraint and seclusion. In addition, all hospitals will be required to have an antibiotic stewardship program in order to participate in Medicare and Medicaid. It will also require all hospitals to have an antibiotic stewardship program which will include a prohibition on discrimination, which must be given to patients in writing. This program will include discussion on the recent five-star rating system implemented by CMS, which has been added to the Hospital Compare website. CMS created the rating system to help patients and their families to identify areas about which they might want to ask questions.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Anyone involved in implementing the hospitals CoPs, including CMOs, CNOs, nurses, nurse educators, TJC coordinator, quality improvement coordinator, risk managers, patient safety, regulatory and compliance officers, hospital legal counsel, risk management, health information management staff. Others who are encouraged to attend include anyone interested in the CMS 5-star rating system found on the CMS Hospital Compare website.

1. Explain how hospitals will have to implement an antimicrobial stewardship program.
2. Discuss how CMS proposes to change licensed independent practitioner (LIP) to licensed practitioner (LP) records so

physicians assistants can order restraint and seclusion, and complete assessments.

3. Describe the policies hospitals must have that should describe which outpatient areas require a RN.
4. Describe the CMS requirement where there should be a final diagnosis in the medical record for all outpatients, within 7 days.
5. Identify the CMS 5-star rating system for hospitals on the Hospital Compare website.
