AIM Statement

 By September 2022, occurrence reporting will be within 10% of average of prior 5 months before go-live using RL Datix software



Measures

- Occurrences were being entered in RL Datix
- Needed to abstract data that was meaningful and to be able to calculate





Selecting Changes

- Ease of entering in information in occurrences to facilitate end-user adoption
- Limit required fields
- Meet requirements for all departments involved in using software



PDSA

 Increase in education and reporting of occurrences in RL Datix software that was purchased in 2020 and to discontinue use of paper occurrence forms.



Implementing Change

- RL Datix software-purchased November 2020
- Go-Live March 1, 2022
 - Severe decease in incident reporting (March/April/May)
 - Criminal Case of Radonda Vaught-verdict
 - Major EMR upgrade 6/1
 - Education done at Department Head meeting
 - Department specific education at monthly meetings
 - Demonstrate at monthly Quality Council
 - 1:1 as needed




Data

- March, April, May-low reporting months (a decrease more than 50% of prior 5 month average)
- Continued with more education and awareness
- By July, were back to what prior average was and this continued in August as well
- September-was our highest reporting month

Spreading Changes

- Continue 1:1 education as needed with users
- Continue monthly education at Quality Council
- As of August 1st, no longer accepting paper occurrence forms
- October-Just Culture with NCPS
