She completed a two-year postdoctoral fellowship at the Portland VA Medical Center with the Mental Illness Research and Education Clinical Center, a certificate program in Human Investigations through Oregon Health & Science University's School of Medicine, and an American Psychological Association-accredited internship at Kaiser Permanente, Los Angeles Medical Center. Dr. Carr's clinical specialty is providing treatment for child and adult survivors of trauma.

Her work has spanned hospital, community mental health, and school settings. Dr. Carr's research interests revolve around assessing and managing threats. She was first author on a well-received article about assessing and managing stalking behaviors in mental health settings in the first volume and issue of the Journal of Threat Assessment and Management. Dr. Carr was presented with an award for distinguished service in 2009 by the American Psychological Association, Society for Clinical Psychology. Dr. Carr has also been a member of the Association of Threat Assessment Professionals since 2012.

He holds a BA from Marquette University and a MA in Business and Organizational Security Management from Webster University. He received CPP (Certified Protection Professional) designation in 1986 and has re-certified for this designation every three years since then.
