OVERVIEW

This presentation will explain what you need to be ready for surveyors and will provide you with better understanding of the CMS infection control interpretative guidelines and worksheet.

Infection control is hit hard during a hospital survey, so every facility should have a full-working familiarity with the CMS interpretive guidelines, as well as the revised worksheet for assessing compliance with the infection control Conditions of Participation (CoPs). This is the first time the worksheet has also been included. Hospitals are encouraged to develop tracer tools to match this worksheet. The worksheets are used by State and Federal surveyors on all survey activities when assessing compliance with the infection control standards.

TARGET AUDIENCE

All infection control staff, including, but not limited to COOs, CMOs, CNOs, senior leadership, board members, physicians, nurses, quality improvement staff, risk managers, epidemiology staff, pharmacy staff, maintenance and environmental services, OR staff and patient safety and compliance staff. Because CMS infection control standards are the same for all hospitals, critical access hospitals (CAHs) are highly encouraged to attend this session as well.
