Do We Mean It?

What are the health disparities you are seeing in your hospital? Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is requiring all hospitals to think differently about and be accountable for addressing health disparities. What does this mean for you?

While sometimes interpreted to mean a racial or ethnic disparity, a health disparity has been

defined as a difference in health that is closely linked with social, economic, and/or environmental disadvantage. If you have a health outcome that is seen to a greater or lesser extent between populations, there is a disparity. Do the farmers in your community have a high incidence of colorectal cancer? Are your children suffering from higher levels of obesity?

The latest research has discovered that the impact of disparities may be up to seven times

higher than the entire burden of heart disease on earth. We say we want to improve health care, but do we mean it? Take these three steps to start working on the causes of health (rather than the consequences of it): 1. Look at your public health department's website to learn about the demographics and

- health of your community. 2. Review the results of your hospital's HIIN Health Equity Assessment.
- 3. Complete the improvements recommended in the Health Equity Organizational Equity <u>Guide</u> to improve the level of equitable care your hospital provides.

Getting Real in Nebraska

- Based on the results of the last Health Equity Assessment, 52 of the 69 HIINparticipating hospitals will make improvements in the next six weeks to be considered a hospital that provides a "Basic" level of equitable care.
- The State Health Improvement Plan and Nebraska's Healthy People 2020 Report are also aimed at reducing health disparities.
