### **OVERVIEW**

Building on the "Coding Scenarios Using ICD-10-PCS" program on December 2, participants will learn to make difficult selections between root operations that seem similar. Critical thinking skills will be stressed and helpful tips will be provided to help participants learn to differentiate between the groups and the individual root operations. Intended as the capstone of the ICD-10-PCS four-part series, attendees will make decisions and code 10 more complex ICD-10-PCS cases.
