- -Creates a regulatory regime for medical cannabis including provisions for a patient registry, caregivers, health care practitioners, producers and processors, registered dispensaries, and testing laboratories. Creates the Cannabis Enforcement Department and the Medical Cannabis Board. Allows certified patients to use or purchase cannabis from a lab or dispensary registered under the act, with documentation required.
- -Allows, but does not require, physicians, osteopathic physicians, and nurse practitioners to certify patients in the registry, limited to 1,100 certifications in a year or 275 in a 90-day period.
- -States the act does not permit anyone to engage in, and allows civil, criminal, or other penalties for: negligence or professional malpractice due to the use of cannabis; possessing or using cannabis on a school bus or van, on school grounds, in a correctional facility or YRTC, or on the grounds of a child care facility or home daycare; inhaling vaporized cannabis on public transportation, around a child, in public (including outdoors), in a motor vehicle, having cannabis in the passenger area of a limo or party bus, or controlling any motor vehicle, aircraft, train, or motorboat or working on vehicles while under the influence of cannabis.
- -States the act does not require an employer to permit or accommodate cannabis in any way, employers can restrict the use of cannabis by employees, employers do not have to accommodate medicinal cannabis use. Does not require Medicaid or private insurance to cover medicinal cannabis costs.
- -States the act does not bar employers from prohibiting the use of cannabis, the act does not allow employees a cause of action for wrongful discharge or discrimination under the act, the act does not prohibit anyone from prohibiting cannabis products on their property, and the act does not prohibit an employer from having and enforcing a drug testing policy, a drug free workplace, or zero tolerance drug policies.
- -Bars employees who are fired for cannabis-related misconduct from receiving unemployment benefits.
- -Allows, but does not require, health care facilities, child care facilities, schools, or foster care facilities to adopt reasonable restrictions on the use of cannabis by students, residents, or persons receiving care, can be more restrictive if allowing access to cannabis causes the facility to lose money or a license under federal law.
- -Provides immunity from arrest, prosecution, or penalty (including by occupational licensing boards) for: providing or selling cannabis to a patient, dispensary, producer, processor, or laboratory; being in the presence of permitted cannabis use; allowing property to be used for permitted activities; or helping a patient administer cannabis.
- -Lists numerous qualifications for certifying patients. Lists numerous prohibitions on health care practitioners certifying patients. Allows pharmacists to dispense cannabis. Provides for continuing education requirements for health practitioners.
- -Directs the Cannabis Enforcement Department to provide for up to 10 cannabis producers in each congressional district to direct delivery of cannabis from dispensaries to patients, and to provide discount cannabis provisions. Producers may also be registered as a processor. Processors must comply with local regulations. Producers must test for quality, may not transport cannabis outside Nebraska.
- -Prohibits smoking cannabis by certified patients. Prohibits discrimination of a cannabis patient in school, housing, medical care, parental rights, or gun ownership.
- -Penalizes false statements relating to medical cannabis certification to avoid arrest as a Class III misdemeanor and disqualification from the program. Includes fines for violations of the act.

Proposed AM824 (Judiciary Committee): Makes two changes to the original bill. Replaces the definition of "qualifying medical condition" to specifically include a current diagnosis of 17 different specific conditions. Changes the continuing medical education requirements, allows the Medicinal Cannabis Board to require further CME course requirements for health care practitioners recommending cannabis to at least 25 patients. Before CME courses are approved by the Medicinal Cannabis Board, a health care practitioner who recommends cannabis to patients can complete at least 8 hours of continuing education approved by a another state, subject to approval by the board.

Proposed AM1364 (Flood): Replaces the definitions of "dispensary" and "qualifying medical condition", requires a dispensary be operated by the Nebraska State Patrol to acquire, possess, or dispense cannabis, lists 17 qualifying medical conditions, and sets out requirements for the dispensary. Would require health care practitioners to complete at least 8 hours of continuing medical education approved by the Medicinal Cannabis Board before issuing a cannabis certification to a patient.

Proposed AM1429 (Hansen, B.): Would add autism and remove PTSD from the list of qualifying medical conditions. Criminalizes patients smoking cannabis. Would include cannabis as a prescription drug in the prescription drug monitoring program. Includes provider education requirements, and a requirement to check the PDMP prior to recommending cannabis. Limits the number of dispensaries the state can register. Removes PTSD from the study conducted by the Medicinal Cannabis Board.

Allows applicants an informal meeting to defend their character with witnesses. Allows application fees be waived if applicant's income is at or below 300% FPL.

Adds provisions of two other bills:

LB263 (Briese) Require occupational boards to issue certain credentials based on credentials or work experience in another jurisdiction – amended to remove the State Electrical Board, does not apply to the Supreme Court, Nebraska Crime Commission, Accountants, viatical settlement brokers, insurance consultants or providers, managing general agents, utilization review agents, surplus lines producers, reinsurance managers and brokers, or public adjusters. LB1153 (McCollister) Change the number of members and qualifications for certain members of the State Electrical Board – amended to change a current at-large position to a second journeyman electrician and an electrical contractor or master electrician spot filled by a labor union affiliate. Requires one of two journeymen to be affiliated with a labor union. Maintains current board membership, becomes effective after current terms.

AM2171 (Brewer): Requires journeyman electricians on the State Electrical Board to be selected from a list recommended by a statewide electrical organization. Changes reciprocal licensing for electricians. -WITHDRAWN 4/8/22

AM2521 (Flood): Exempts any occupation regulated by the Board of Engineers and Architects or the State Real Estate Commission. -WITHDRAWN 4/8/22

AM2248 (Hilkemann): Exempts from the automatic reciprocity provision "a credential issued by an occupational board under the Uniform Credentialing Act which issues credentials based on reciprocity." -LOST 4/8/22

AM2707 (McCollister): Technical corrections and clean up language. Requires the journeyman electrician on the State Electrical Board be selected from a list recommended by an the labor union. For the military occupation reciprocity, clarifies eligibility, and limits the jurisprudential training to no more than ten clock hours. No longer limited to "felony" convictions, applies to any conviction specified under the act. Requires occupational boards to adopt rules and regulations no later than January 1, 2024 and provide to the Legislative committee of jurisdiction. Applicants are not required to disclose a conviction older than 5 years, up from 3 years in the original bill. Excludes the Department of Banking and Finance, the Board of Engineers and Architects, and the State Real Estate Commission. -WITHDRAWN 4/8/22

An insurance policy may offer, but shall not require: (i) The use of a home infusion pharmacy to dispense clinician-administered drugs to patients in their homes; or (ii) The use of an infusion site external to a patient's provider office or clinic.

Section 1 to 3 transfer \$500,000 on April 30, 2022, and \$1 million on July 1, 2022, from the General Fund to the Community College State Dependents Fund and create the Community College State Dependents Fund.

Section 4 creates the Perkins County Canal Project Fund. The fund can be used for design, engineering, permitting, and options to purchase land related to building a canal as outlined by the South Platte River Compact and to contract with an independent firm for the purposes of completing a study of such canal.

Section 5 creates the Military Base Development and Support Fund. The fund shall be used to contribute to construction, development, or support on any military base, located in Nebraska, for purposes of improving mission retention and recruitment; supporting the morale, health, and mental wellness of military members and families; and growing the economic impact of military bases in Nebraska.

Section 6 creates the Trail Development and Maintenance Fund. The fund shall be used to provide grants to natural resources districts to assist in completing the Missouri-Pacific trail between the cities of Lincoln and Omaha.

Section 7 creates the Jobs and Economic Development Initiative Fund. The fund shall be used for water and recreational projects pursuant to the Jobs and Economic Development Initiative Act. An amount, not to exceed twenty million dollars, shall be available for site selection costs, feasibility and public water supply studies, and flood mitigation costs related to any projects pursuant to the Jobs and Economic Development Initiative Act. No funds shall be expended for any other project unless additional conditions are met.

Section 8 creates the Water Recreation Enhancement Fund. The fund shall be used for water and recreational projects pursuant to the Water Recreation Enhancement Act.

Sections 9 and 10 create the Surface Water Irrigation Infrastructure Fund, which shall be used to provide grants to irrigation districts, and authorize the Department of Natural Resources to establish procedures and criteria for awarding grants for repair or construction of physical structures for irrigation projects.

Section 11 amends the Health Care Cash Fund statute to amend the transfer on July 15, 2022, to the fund from \$51 million to \$66.2 million and to authorize a transfer of \$15 million from the Health Care Cash Fund to the University of Nebraska for pancreatic cancer research at the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Such transfer is contingent on certification of matching funds.

Section 12 amends provisions related to the 211 Information and Referral Network to increase grant award amounts from \$300,000 per year to \$955,000 per year.

Section 13 amends the Governor's Emergency Cash Fund to authorize transfers to the Cash Reserve Fund and the General Fund at the direction of the Legislature and includes a transfer of \$14 million to the Cash Reserve Fund by June 30, 2023.

Section 14 to 16 amend provisions related to the internship programs to redefine terms, expand eligibility, increase grant award amounts for internships, clarify eligible reimbursable expenses, require reporting, and provide for contracting with a non-profit entity to carry out provisions.

Section 17 to 20 amend provisions related to the Site and Building Development Fund to allow initiatives that improve military installations to include a grant for the establishment of the United State Strategic Command Nuclear Command, Control, and Communications public-private-partnership facility and to require matching funds for any such project.

Section 21 to 24 amend provisions of the Business Innovation Act to define redevelopment areas, to require preference for projects within economic redevelopment areas, to include innovation hubs within the scope of the act, to increase the annual total amount for microloans from \$2 million to \$3 million, and to increase the maximum award amount for microloans from \$100,000 to \$150,000.

Section 28 amends the Vocational and Life Skills Programming Fund to limit use of the fund to grants for certain entities, and to expand the list of priorities for the Department of Correctional Services in awarding such grants. There is also an annual transfer of \$5 million from the Prison Overcrowding Contingency Fund for each of the next 3 years.
