OVERVIEW

April 1, 2015, CMS issued the latest interpretive guidelines on restraint and seclusion for hospitals. This program will discuss the most problematic standards in the restraint section and can help hospitals meet CMS and The Joint Commission guidelines, and take the mystery out of the restraint and seclusion interpretive guidelines. It will also provide a crosswalk to The Joint Commission standards. It will include such things as what is a required for an internal log, as well as reporting requirements for medical records.

- Define the CMS restraint requirement of what a hospital must document in the internal log if a patient dies within 24 hours of having two soft wrist restraints on.
- Discuss CMS requirements which state that all physicians and others who order restraints must be educated on the hospital policy.

- Describe CMS restraint education requirements for staff.
- Discuss CMS specifics that need to be documented in the medical record for the one hour face to face evaluation on patients who are violent and or self-destructive.
