OVERVIEW

This webinar will focus on establishing interdisciplinary teams to create and run simulations to test disaster preparedness with respect to scenarios testing the ability of the hospital to respond to transfusion emergencies. Focus on proper patient identification and product tracking, rapid dispensing, minimizing wastage and managing a limited inventory will be addressed. The importance of having cross disciplinary teams and including both the blood provider and transfusion service in department wide simulations will be addressed. National resources for simulation planning will be shared.

OBJECTIVES

- Learn how to implement emergency drills and simulations utilizing a multidisciplinary team.
- Become familiar with emerging evidence in simulation science to create a curriculum for emergency response.
- Know examples of tools for managing clinical emergencies, including development of a rapid response team, protocols, and transfusion preparedness.

Dr. Gorlin founded the stem cell apheresis and processing and cord blood program at Children's Hospital in Boston where he also served as medical director of transfusion services. He has held various positions at Children's Hospital and the Dana Farber Cancer Institute. His principal teaching affiliates at Harvard Medical School, received his MD from Yale University and has received degrees from the University of Minnesota Carlson School of Business and Stanford University.
