Quarter and Year

This table provides **counts** of total falls reported for each quarter over time (row 1) and **percentages** of those total falls that were either unassisted (row 2) or injurious (row 3). Unassisted falls occur when no staff is providing hands-on assist to control a patient's descent to a lower surface and are more likely to result in patient injury. Injurious falls occur when a patient experiences any type of fall-related injury ranging from skin tears or bruising to fracture or head injury. Green cells in the table indicate quarters when *no* falls were reported for a given fall type, while cells with the *least desirable* outcomes (high total fall counts or high percentages of total falls that were unassisted or injurious) across all quarters displayed in the table are shown in red.

Quarter and Year

This table provides **counts** of falls reported for each quarter over time and indicates whether the falls were assisted and resulted in harm. Assisted falls occur when staff provides hands-on assist to control a patient's descent to a lower surface. Unassisted falls do not involve hands-on assistance and are more likely to result in patient injury. Extent of harm classifications are defined as follows: **Minor**: Fall resulted in application of dressing, ice, cleaning of wound, limb elevation, topical medication, bruise or abrasion; **Moderate**: Fall resulted in suturing, application of steri-strips/skin glue, splinting or muscle/joint strain; **Major**: Fall resulted in surgery, casting, traction, consultation for neurological or internal injury, or need for blood products; **Death**: Patient died as a result of injuries sustained from the fall. Green cells indicate quarters when *no* falls were reported for a given fall type, while cells with the *least desirable* outcomes (unassisted vs. assisted falls and greater extent of harm) across all quarters displayed in the table are shown in red.

Quarter and Year

This table provides **counts** of total falls reported for each quarter over time (row 1), and **percentages** of those falls for which completion of a post-fall huddle was documented (row 2). A post-fall huddle is a focused conversation among staff (sometimes including the patient and/or family) to learn from a fall and take action to prevent future falls. For row 1, green cells indicate quarters when *no* falls were reported, while the cell with the *highest* fall count across all quarters displayed in the table is shown in red. For row 2, cells with the *most desirable* (higher percentages) completion of post-fall huddles are shown in green, while *least desirable* (lower percentages) completion of post-fall huddles are shown in varying shades of yellow, orange, or red.
