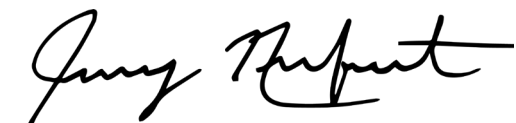

TOTAL ECONOMIC IMPACT OF NEBRASKA HOSPITALS

This number represents the overall contribution of hospitals to Nebraska's economy, including direct spending, employment, and the ripple effects on other industries. Nebraska hospitals play a massive financial role in the state, driving economic stability, supporting local businesses, and contributing to the overall prosperity of Nebraskans.



JOBS PROVIDED BY NEBRASKA HOSPITALS

Each of the 55,853 hospital jobs supported about one additional job in the broader economy. Overall, hospitals contributed 114,091 jobs to total employment, accounting for 10.7% of total non-farm employment.



HOSPITAL PAYROLL & BENEFITS

This encompasses the total wages and benefits paid to hospital employees, representing a substantial investment in Nebraska's workforce, providing stable jobs and income for thousands of residents.

TOTAL COMMUNITY BENEFITS

This is the total financial value of all community benefit programs provided by hospitals, including uncompensated care and bad debt. This figure highlights hospitals' commitment to addressing community health needs, particularly for vulnerable populations.

UNCOMPENSATED CARE & CHARITY CARE

This number includes the costs of charity care and the financial shortfalls from government programs like Medicare and Medicaid. Hospitals serve as a safety net for those who may not otherwise have access to care, continually working to eliminate barriers to health care services.

CASH & IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS

This represents direct financial contributions, donations, and grants made by hospitals to community organizations and initiatives. These contributions support vital community programs and services, strengthening the social fabric of Nebraska.

HEALTH PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

This is the total amount hospitals spent on the education of health professionals in Nebraska. This investment helps ensure that there is a future health care workforce and that the workforce is well-trained, improving the quality of health care available in our communities.

TOTAL SUBSIDIZED HEALTH SERVICES

This number includes the costs of providing essential clinical services that are subsidized by hospitals, often at a financial loss. This ensures access to critical health care services that may not be financially viable otherwise, such as emergency and trauma care, neonatal intensive care, behavioral health services, and services for women and children.

COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT SERVICES

This represents investments in programs that address the Social Determinants of Health, such as access to healthy food and safe housing, as well as preventive care and improving the overall health and well-being of the community.

BAD DEBT

This is the amount of money that hospitals are unable to collect from patients for services rendered. While this is a negative number from an operating standpoint, hospitals are committed to providing care to every patient, regardless of their ability and/or willingness to pay.

This includes investments in programs that improve the community's infrastructure and social well-being, such as workforce development and housing initiatives. These activities strengthen the community's foundation and create a healthier environment for residents.

Home to the largest behavioral health service outside of Omaha in terms of providers and services, our hospital is removing barriers to care through same-day access for new patients, online scheduling, and open doors for all existing patients. Our specialists collaborate with schools, probation offices, and local jails to provide comprehensive mental health support.

Great Plains Health, North Platte

Our hospital has made significant and ongoing improvements to behavioral health services in response to the growing need in our community. We have expanded outpatient services and maintain a robust inpatient program serving patients from across the state of Nebraska. Our teams also focus on community advocacy and education, with efforts to build trust, foster understanding, and reduce the stigma surrounding mental health treatment.

Methodist Fremont Health, Fremont

In the 2023 reporting period, our hospital screened over 38,000 patients for depression and managed nearly 25,000 behavioral health visits. In 2026, in partnership with the Mental Health Innovation Foundation, we opened the Behavioral Health & Wellness Center that provides a world-class model of comprehensive behavioral and mental health care with inpatient, outpatient, and partial hospitalization needs co-located with medical health needs.

Children’s Nebraska, Omaha

To address the growing need for specialized care, our hospital recruited additional child and adolescent psychiatrists and providers, significantly bolstering capacity. Telepsychiatry services have also been expanded, bringing critical support to rural and underserved areas, including Critical Access Hospitals across Nebraska. This expansion now encompasses new locations such as Albion, Alliance, Lexington, McCook, Sidney, Tecumseh, Valentine, Wahoo, and Wayne, building upon the already existing services in Norfolk, Howard County, Kearney YRTC, and Superior.

Following a record-breaking year with 289 deliveries in 2025, our hospital is further investing in its maternal care team. We are currently recruiting a fourth OB-GYN to support our patient and community needs.

Beatrice Community Hospital & Health Center, Beatrice

Our hospital recently opened a new labor and delivery wing, increasing delivery room space and adding a family waiting room. To enhance patient safety, we have implemented the JADA system, a vital tool designed to control postpartum bleeding and prevent maternal mortality.

Brodstone Healthcare, Superior

Bryan Health and Bryan Medical Center launched the Bryan Baby app as well as an online screening tool for postpartum depression to support new families. We also introduced a postpartum wristband program to alert first responders and providers to the recent delivery that may impact patient health status as well as NICU telemedicine behavioral health services to quickly identify health crises in new mothers and connect patients to resources.

Bryan Medical Center, Lincoln

We are a Level II NICU and offer breastfeeding support, childbirth classes, and support groups for expecting mothers. We engage in perinatal quality improvement projects through the Nebraska Perinatal Quality Improvement Collaborative and with community partners to connect patients to resources and strengthen support.

Grand Island Regional Medical Center, Grand Island

We expanded Medicare population enrollment to our Chronic Care Management program by 50%, focusing on education, medication adherence and patient health goals. Additionally, home health staff provide regular blood pressure screenings at the local Senior Citizen Center to support community wellness.

Cherry County Hospital, Valentine

To ensure high-quality local senior care, our hospital invested \$9 million in improvements to our assisted living building. Our collaboration with the local nursing home and assisted living facility keeps essential services attractive and accessible for area seniors.

Franciscan Healthcare, West Point

Our hospital adopted the national Age-Friendly Health initiative. This program focuses on the 4Ms: What Matters, Medication, Mentation, and Mobility to align clinical care with the specific health goals and safety needs of older adults. The program improves senior care and reduces hospital readmissions.

Crete Area Medical Center, Crete

Our hospital recently invested \$2.2 million to support nursing home and assisted living operations, including the addition of a new secure memory care unit. These enhancements ensure a safe, sustainable continuum of care for residents with cognitive impairments.

Sidney Regional Medical Center, Sidney

Our nursing home recently became a designated CNA training site, hosting classes that graduate approximately 48 students per year. The program has not only improved patient care by reducing reliance on contract labor but has also strengthened the local health care talent pool.

Gordon Memorial Health Services, Gordon

We actively invest in workforce development through ongoing partnerships with regional schools and universities. During the past fiscal year, we supported medical resident training rotations, hosted nursing and allied health students for clinical experiences, welcomed university health care students for facility tours and specialty shadowing opportunities, and provided job-shadow experiences for high school students to promote early exposure to health care careers and strengthen the future workforce pipeline.

Kearney County Health Services, Kearney

Pender Community Hospital invests deeply in the people who serve our community every day. We offer tuition assistance to help current staff advance their education and loan repayment options to attract and retain providers in a rural setting. By attending local career fairs and maintaining a robust student shadowing program across disciplines, we are actively building the next generation of health care professionals.

Pender Community Hospital, Pender

In partnership with UNMC and UNK, our hospital is expanding the rural health care pipeline with a focus on non-traditional students and veterans. These educational efforts help support expanded access to inpatient services.
